



Situated between Bordeaux and Bergerac, the property of the Bireaud family – Les Hauts de Riquet – belongs to the appellation Côtes de Duras. Small but rich in stories, the AOC was created in 1937 by the great grandfather of Pierre.

The vineyards of Les Hauts de Riquet cover 20 hectares, in three different types of soils and with the growing of six types grapes.

For reds, the Merlot, Cabernet Franc and Malbec are mixed with harmony. The two latter are responsible for the finesse and spicy aromas of wines. For whites, the Sauvignon, Sémillon and Chenin complement each others, expressing both dry white wines for partying or liqueurs for tasting.

From the vineyard to the cellar, the principles that guide our work are based on the respect for the fruit and the expression of our terroir, all the more with our strongly rooted principles about our commitment to the organic and biodynamic agriculture.

Our wines come mainly from manual harvesting and are then reared in tanks but almost always in barrels for several wines. The very regular tasting with our wine oenologist plays also an essential role.

The respect for the grape, the absence of chemical flavoring additions, the requirement of a final quality, these are the keys of our work.

We want to create alive, warm and expressive wines, which express us and our country.
